MORE THAN A PAIR OF GLASSES

Mehluli struggled to read the letters in his books. Everything was starting to get blurry. He knew he needed help from a doctor. Luckily, Mehluli lived with his siblings at Khayelihle Children's Village in Zimbabwe. He knew they would help him to get some new glasses!

Mehluli's elder sister was 17 when she started caring for her three younger siblings. Their mother passed away, and their father left the children while struggling with depression. Mehluli and his siblings were vulnerable without any adults to care for them.

In 2009, someone reported their situation to the Department of Social Welfare. Khayelihle Children's Village was contacted and cared for Mehluli and his two younger siblings. "I was seven years old," Mehluli said.

KCV had a significant impact on Mehluli's life. The siblings received a safe and secure home, education, and healthcare. "Meeting up with new parents and new friends developed me socially and



emotionally. Now, I have people to share my problems with," he reflected. KCV also developed me spiritually," he explained.

While living at KCV, Mehluli experienced health challenges. "All my medical bills were paid for every time when I fell sick. When I had eye complications, KCV paid for my medical bills and bought me a pair of spectacles," he shared.

KCV also provides the children with new school uniform items each year, such as a new shirt, skirt, shorts, or shoes. A uniform instils confidence in a child, so they proudly wear it to school.

KCV gave Mehluli and his siblings a safe and secure home with people who cared for their well-being. Mehluli attended school with his siblings. Everyone dressed smartly, and Mehluli was excited to wear his new glasses.

Thanks to your support of KCV, Mehluli is now a successful young adult. He is focused on creating a better future for himself. He is currently completing his second year at university. "If it were not for KCV, I would have never reached this stage," he said.

Mehluli wants to thank everyone who "had a hand" in supporting him and his siblings.

At the beginning of November, a team of five Churches of Christ leaders from Australia, travelled to Indonesia to meet with our partners-the Christian Church Theological School of Indonesia (CCTSI) and Asia Pacific Christian Mission International School (API).

It was a wonderful experience highlighting the importance of being holistic in mission.

The students from CCTSI and API are trained on integral mission by learning theology and how to sustain themselves in ministry with service in their community. Each weekend students are sent to join various ministries that are meeting needs. We witnessed some of this service.

From hiking up the mountains and visiting a small farm, observing a preschool, to an iced tea shop on a busy streetside, we learned how initiatives like education and small business can be used to sustain church planting initiatives.

In one village, we visited a preschool education ministry that provides a safe place for vulnerable children to learn. We observed beautiful preschool teachers interacting with their students and saw the benefits of offering good quality education in a remote, rural setting.

Meeting the needs of the community also helps local church leaders build relationships. We were greeted by the chief and his wife at their village. This highlights the hard work, time, effort and goodwill our partners have established in the community.

Many people in the communities we visited work as rice field farmers, plantation workers, and traders. Our partner, Gideon, from (API), said that local churches have provided training in iron welding or even to create fishponds. Others are engaged in cooking skills and learning to make and sell chips.

These skills lead to business opportunities, open doors to build relationships and share the gospel while churches are planted. They can also help to support the church and its members as they grow.

We were encouraged by the way the students and graduates live out Christ's call and follow His example. They are loving on their neighbours in such powerful ways. They are beacons of light in so many different areas, and they are participating in God's mission through word and deed.

It was a pleasure to be able to spend time with our partners and to visit many different church plants and see their hard work in action.

Western Australia

Beginning in WA, BJ and Chipo kicked off their National Speaking Tour at Subi Church with a special supporter event followed by church services at True North Church, where BJ's message was streamed online and live to a second campus. Following this, BJ and Chipo shared some inspirational stories at Bassendean Church of Christ and had a unique opportunity to connect with over 100 faithful supporters at True North Church's weekly Senior's gathering. After an enjoyable visit to Kings Parks (Kaarta Garup), BJ recorded an interview on Perth's Christian radio station, Sonshine, which broadcasts to nearly half a million listeners each month.









Tasmania

While BJ and Chipo didn't get to visit Tasmania this time, they did chat with supporters through a Zoom call while they were in Melbourne. It was so encouraging!



New South Wales

In NSW, BJ and Chipo loved meeting with the COCOA team and attended the Collective Conference at Stanwell Tops, south of Sydney, with more than 170 delegates. Colin Scott from COCOA said BJ shared a hope-filled message that got delegates thinking outside their comfort zones. "BJ outlined the challenges of distance, drought and poverty that evangelists in Zimbabwe face and the good news that God is with them and continues to bring new people into the Kingdom despite the challenges," he shared.









Victoria

In VIC, One Church in Blackburn became BJ and Chipo's home base. On Sunday afternoon, BJ preached in the service. A time of fellowship was organised with many of their long-term friends and supporters, including a moment of prayer with former Global Mission Partners Executive Officer, John Gilmore.

Emergency Relief Restores Peace for Mary



Mary fled with her children to escape violence in Sudan during the April 2023 conflict. In the panic, she was separated from her husband. Mary used to live in South Sudan, so she was returning home. But crossing the border, she faced a fight for her survival.

Help from our partner Christian Mercy International (CMI) saved Mary's life.

Mary was one of 1,500 people crossing the border into South Sudan daily. CMI worked with local authorities to support women and children entering the country. With your generosity, Global Mission Partners could fund emergency support to many of the women.

"I thank God that the local authority connected us with Christian Mercy International," Mary said.

Mary fled without anything to support her livelihood. "[I left] without anything in terms of property, such as household utensils, [for my home], and clothing for my children". Her husband is still missing.

CMI gave Mary plastic sheets for temporary shelter, food, blankets and mosquito nets.

These items were a lifeline for Mary and her children.

Eventually, Mary was reconnected with the community which her family was originally from. The chief allocated her a small piece of land to farm. CMI continued assisting Mary this year by providing food support while she started farming.

Mary planted sorghum, groundnuts, okra, and pumpkin in March this year. Then, there was significant flooding. Luckily, her farm escaped the flooding, which helped her plants to grow. Paulino Malou, CMI Director, provided photographs of Mary's sorghum field in September. It looked tall and plentiful.

Mary harvested her crops during October and November and plans to construct a permanent dwelling on the allocated land. "I will use this harvest to secure my construction," she explains.

It has turned out well for Mary, but not everyone's story has had such a peaceful ending.

CMI is assisting 80 women who have returned home to South Sudan to escape the violence. Like Mary, they also received land for farming. Unfortunately, the recent floods affected 50 women's farmlands. Their crops are destroyed, and the soil is damaged.

With your help, CMI can continue supporting the women while they re-establish their farms.

Mary is thankful for the love CMI shows to her and the other women, which has empowered them to establish new lives for themselves within a fragile country.

Mary appreciates "the support of basic needs" that enabled her to reach where she is today.

Christian Mercy International has managed three emergency response projects in recent years and has developed a positive relationship with the Relief and Rehabilitation Commission, which helps to manage emergencies.

New Wheels and New Friends for Atap

Atap believed she'd never be able to do much because of her disability. She can't walk. She didn't attend school. She had only one friend and relied on her family for everything. This affected her perception of herself from a young age. "It makes me a failure," she thought.

Christian Mercy International (CMI) works in Atap's community, providing access to education for vulnerable children. CMI assists ten schools in the district. They support children and their carers through livelihood activities. When they met Atap's, they wanted to help her see her value.

With your support, they bought Atap a wheelchair.

"Upon receiving a wheelchair from CMI, my life was restored," Atap declared.

The wheelchair gave Atap confidence and enabled her to enrol in her local school. "I never had an idea of going to school, let alone doing anything on my own because I cannot walk," she reflected.

With the wheelchair, Atap gained independence.

Now, Atap can be like the other children. "With this wheelchair, my life has changed. I began to go to school now like any other neighbour's children and started making friends in our classroom," she said.

The wheelchair has also ended Atap's isolation. Before having a wheelchair, it was difficult for Atap to make friends. "Even though I had one [friend], we could not move together as friends do." With her new wheelchair, Atap can now get to know more friends at school!

Because of your support, CMI helped Atap realise she has a purpose. Despite Atap having "feeble legs," she discovered her independence through the support of a wheelchair. She now has confidence in herself and dreams for the future.

"I learned that being disabled is not inability; I might be disabled physically, but my brain is not,"



Atap said. "I will continue with my studies up to class eight. By God's grace, I can finish my high school."

December 3 is International Day of People with Disability. Our partners aim to serve the most vulnerable in their communities. This includes people with disability. Many of our partners work with people with disability to provide practical help and restore dignity where they have been marginalised.

Breaking Ground for Training Facilities in Manila

Finding a permanent location was "a long-cherished vision" for the International Christian College of Manila (ICCM). Thanks to a new partnership venture with the Churches of Christ Project 7 church in the Philippines, the college is one step closer to its dream.

ICCM was renting facilities, causing uncertainty for the future of the college. Now, with a permanent location secured, they have hope that one day soon, it will host the new ICCM college facilities. The future facilities will also include a new church worship centre for the Project 7 church.

College leadership and church leaders jointly "broke ground" in

October during a simple ceremony. "On this ground will soon rise the permanent campus," Pastor Gerwin from ICCM reported.

The groundbreaking ceremony formally marks the start of a new faith journey for the staff and the 70 students enrolled.

"Plans have been drawn up, and strategies formulated for proceeding with the building and the eventual transfer to the new campus," Ricardo Garcia, ICCM President, reports.

This is great news for the college, and ICCM asks for prayer support as they navigate the next steps. They have faith in God's ongoing provision.



"God's work, done in God's way, will never lack God's provision," Pastor Gerwin said.

The new location is a significant step forward for the college. It will help ensure ICCM can continue to develop faithful leaders into the future.
